- EU laws to protect children online, e.g. Directive 2011/93/EU on combating the sexual abuse and sexual exploitation of children and child pornography, Audiovisual Media Services Directive (AVMSD), the GDPR, commercial practices, new Digital Services Act,
- Funding: coordination & portal plus Safer Internet Centres in EU + Iceland + Norway https://www.betterinternetforkids.eu/web/portal/policy/insafe-inhope
 - Cooperation with MS & with industry & civil society (Alliance to better protect minors online)
