


Population structure by sex (%), 2019





Children (aged 0-14) and persons aged 65 and over (%), 2019







#### System design reasons / Why it is the way it is

Concept / criteria for classification

Distribution of support / burdens

Issues, messages and policy measures

Political / value forces dominated the situation of the group

#### **Problems and Consequences**



- results of a divorce or separation;
- 95% of cases it is the woman who is granted custody of the child;
- legal framework established: the woman is automatically considered to be the primary caregiver of the child in Lithuania.

#### Chronology of policy decisions, LT

#### 1991-1996

- the most generous year for single mothers with children;
- 1994-1995
   Stigmatizing policies begin;
- All support for single parents stops;
   First Concept of Family Policy;

1999

- the worst financial situation of single parent families is recognized, but the blame is shifted to the families;
- Family policy becomes fragmented, direction of the married family


2001-2004 till now


- Shaming policy develops neither members of society nor policy makers want to be associated with single parent families;
- child rights, custody and strengthening the married family come into force

Minimum wage 642 Euro, two adults with children \*2; **Taxes:** 7.5% income tax and 19.5% social security contributions on employment income







Non-tested benefits: child benefits (number of children, €70 per child);




#### Budget constraints for single mothers

### RESULTS

- Single parents are not singled out as a separate target group in the programmes;
- all services and measures should be individualized and tailored to the specific needs and situation of the individual family





## State support received by single parents with children

Support for all families

Child benefit

Maternity / Paternity / Child care Leave

Labour Code benefits for working families with children

Education services, discounts for public transport, benefits for unformal education (one), After-school day centers

Budget-financed health care services

Law on Equal Opportunities on family status

Support for special social needs situations

Social benefits

Orphans', Disability benefits

Birth benefits; for twins

Support for large families ; Family card

Housing rent compensation, Social housing

Support for the raising children alone

Child support Fund (benefit if father does not pay alimony)

In some cases, access to a discount at school

Labour Code obligation for employer / special measures

reasons why mothers have little capacity

Child needs, poverty, OR reasons of parent's capacities

Lack of attention for causes of poverty in singlemother families

 no analysis how overcome, how they interact
